Wingate's School Focus 2019-2020

Thank you to everyone who was able to attend this year's parent information night(s)! We appreciate your support. We also realize the life can be busy, which presents challenges – especially in the evening as parents try to navigate work, activities and meals. If you missed it, please take a moment to read over our continued focus around literacy instruction this year:

- Writing instruction with a focus on engaging writers.
 - K-2 Phonics Instruction
- Balanced Literacy - with district purchased curricular resources (continued focus from last year.)



With a school wide focus on literacy, teacher teams had an opportunity to develop beliefs about writing instruction at Wingate. The articulation of core beliefs allows teachers to align instructional practices directly to those beliefs. There were some common threads across all grade levels:

- Young writers need **TIME** to write **EVERYDAY!**
- Direct, explicit writing instruction is necessary for our young writers.
- Writing should be authentic, meaningful and engaging. We do this by providing **VOICE** and **CHOICE** for students' writing.
- Young writers need a **PURPOSE** for writing and must have opportunities to talk about and share their writing.

News from the School Counselor

Hello from the Counseling Department! I hope your year is off to a great start. In September, 5th grade will be reviewing and revising goals they set at the end of 4th grade. We will also begin our yearlong learning about coping skills during emotional times. 4th grade will read the book, *I Am Human*, and discuss how each of us is human. This will be a launching pad for our yearlong learning about our emotional spectrum. 3rd grade has already started learning about HA HA SO, a strategy for dealing with interpersonal relationship problems. We will learn about appropriately using humor to defuse situations. 2nd graders will revisit their writing about coming to 2nd grade, which they wrote about last May. We will compare those expected feelings with how they are feeling now. 1st graders will start a unit of study on Growth Mindset, including writing our own books! Throughout the year in Kindergarten, we are working on emotional awareness, expanding our emotional vocabulary and friendship.

What do teachers do on days when students do not attend?

As you know, students do not have school on September 16th and 17th. Even though students are not in attendance, teachers have specific responsibilities to fulfill on those days. September 16th is *Educator Effectiveness Day*. Each year teachers are evaluated using a state rubric. Part of a teacher's evaluation is to set professional goals as well as student learning goals. The process of setting meaningful goals is time consuming, but also can have positive impacts on student growth. Therefore, we ask that parents do not request meetings with teachers on September 16th. September 17th is a Teacher Workday. On Teacher Workdays, many teachers work in teams in order to collaboratively plan grade level units. Teacher availability varies on Teacher Workdays and parent meetings are at the discretion of the teacher.


